ABERDEEN PETROLEUM CLUB GOLF ASSOCIATION MEN'S 9 SECTION GOLDEN RULES



We are an inclusive group of golfers with different skills and abilities and are tolerant and respectful of each other and other players using the course at Kippie. We agree to abide by the rules of golf and in particular the following 'Golden Rules';

1. Teeing Off - Arrive at least 20 minutes before your scheduled Tee Time to allow time to set up your equipment and warm-up before your scheduled Tee Time (or earlier if the course is free) to avoid late starts and disrupting the whole field.

NB Do not Tee off on the first Tee until the 7th Green is free.

2. When another player is on the Tee, stand at 90 or 45 Degrees to the players chest and at least 2-3 yards away to avoid distracting them. Do not talk, move, or engage in anything that could generate noise and movement and distract the player.

NB Mobile phones should be put on 'Silent'.

- 3. When on the Green, check that you are out of the player's line of sight and check that your shadow does not interfere with the player. Never step on the Green between the hole and your opponent's putting line.
- 4. Players must replace grass divots on fairways, repair pitch marks on greens and rake marks and footprints in bunkers. Players should also repair other pitch marks on greens that other golfers may have failed to repair.
- 5. Order of play the person furthest from the Green plays first and you mustn't walk ahead and put yourself in the 'line of fire'.
- 6. 'Ready Golf' or 'Play Without Delay'
 - a. Speed up playing as much as possible and if you land in the rough, allow a maximum of three minutes to find your ball then take a drop and penalty.
 NB A Provisional Ball should be played if there is any doubt that your ball may be lost.
 - b. It is the group's responsibility to keep up with the group in front and if you lose a clear hole, you should invite the group (or single player) behind you to play through.

- c. Whoever is ready plays first.
- d. Clear the green as soon as possible mark your card/update your scores on mobile devices and replace clubs <u>off the green</u> to avoid delaying players behind you.
- e. Plan get your next club ready as you approach your next shot.
- f. Leave your golf bag/trolley at the next Tee Box, or at the end of the Green where you will exit for the next Tee Box. This will clear the Green quickly for the players behind you.
- 7. Out of Bounds a ball is out of bounds when it is beyond any wall, fence, hedge, or the line of white stakes defining the boundary of the course.
- 8. When moving from the 7th to the 8th Tee, be mindful of players Teeing off on the 1st Tee and stop moving and talking to avoid distracting them.
- 9. Removable obstructions and no play zones free relief can be taken from all artificial objects (e.g., benches, bins sprinkler heads), artificially surfaced paths (including drainage channels behind the first green) and staked trees or any young trees below two club lengths in height.
- 10.Red stakes denote penalty areas.
- 11.Members should shout 'Fore' where there is a risk of a wayward ball striking another player.
- 12.Markers have an obligation to check and monitor scores and not just rubber stamp/accept them.
- 13. There should be a maximum of three players per tee time to maintain the pace of play and avoid delaying players behind you.
- NB The 'R&A Rules of Golf' App is free to download and allows you to browse all the rules and even take a quiz to test your understanding!
